SOLUTIONS AT WORK IN FLORIDA

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) was established to develop, maintain, and regulate transportation on Florida's roadways. FDOT is comprised of seven Districts, Florida's Turnpike Enterprise, and the Central Office.

FDOT maintains a State Highway System of more than 12,000 centerline miles and 42,082 lane miles. As part of its annual program, FDOT is committed to making significant investments in intelligent transportation systems (ITS).

The FDOT ITS Program endeavors to provide a safe transportation system with transportation technologies that enhance safety, improve mobility, support commerce, and help sustain the environment. ITS directly improves traffic flow and reduces congestion by allowing transportation agencies to operate their systems as efficiently and safely as possible. Major elements in Florida's ITS Program include: congestion management, traffic incident management, emergency management, and traveler information.
